



## Florida Sheriff Sounds the Alarm: Judd Says Amendment 3 is a 'Trick'

Polk County Sheriff Grady Judd recently addressed the public regarding Amendment 3, which proposes the legalization of recreational marijuana in Florida. In a candid discussion, Judd expressed his concerns about the implications of the amendment and urged voters to carefully consider their decision.

"I work for you. Whatever you decide is what I'm going to obey, but I am providing some education," he said at the start of his remarks. Judd emphasized that the amendment appears to be a ploy by wealthy marijuana groups, stating, "A very few wealthy marijuana groups that started out with medical marijuana got together and spent millions of dollars to get Amendment 3 on the ballot and it's a trick to trick you."

One of Judd's primary concerns is the amendment's prohibition on home cultivation. He pointed out, "You can buy their marijuana, bring it home and smoke it, but guess what? You can't grow your own marijuana. So while you can possess it, you can't plant one in your backyard without going to jail."

Judd also criticized the amendment's assurances regarding funding for education and law enforcement. "There is not







Where do you go when you are wounded by someone close to you?

Enemies may insult you, but you often have your guard up with an enemy. The deepest wounds can come not from enemies, but from friends and family.

Friends and family have the ammunition to hurt you. You have opened the doors of your heart to them, letting your guard down and exposing your most vulnerable places. Maybe it is a spouse who leaves for someone else, friends who aren't there when you need them most, or a parent who abandons you.

In Psalm 55, King David shows us that he knows the betrayal of a friend. David has many enemies. But the worst ones are his closest friends with whom he once enjoyed "sweet fellowship" (Psalm 55:13-14). He wants to run from the anguish and escape the pain (v. 6-8). So David runs - not away from his hurt, but to His Lord who saves.

The word "save" in this verse is from Hebrew which means "to deliver". It means to bring someone out of harm into a spacious place of abundance and victory.

When someone you love wounds you, you can always take refuge in the friendship of God. God is steadfast in His love for you, and His love is bigger than any betrayal, rejection, or hurt you may be suffering. Running to Him means you can experience abundance and victory even amid betrayal.

God remains faithful, strong, and true, even if everyone else fails you. When you choose to trust God with your deepest hurt, He frees you from feeling stuck or trapped and brings you into a spacious place.

God also brings you victory, and you can resist the temptation to hold a grudge or take matters into your own hands. You can rest in Him, knowing that He is the only one worthy to judge and execute justice on your behalf. Call to God, rest in Him, and exchange betrayal and hurt for abundance and victory.

## Marion County Debris Collection Kicks Off

Marion County residents impacted by Hurricane Milton can expect debris collection for tree and vegetative debris to begin on Wednesday, October 16, 2024. The initial focus will be on clearing the major roadways to ensure safe passage throughout the county.

Residents are asked to place tree limbs and other vegetative debris along the edge of the roadway in areas free of obstructions such as power lines, fire hydrants, and trees. All debris must be placed curbside by the end of the day on Sunday, October 27, 2024. It is important to note that this service only covers tree debris and vegetative material. It will not collect yard clippings, construction debris, household garbage, or any materials from lot clearing. For residents who prefer to drop off debris themselves, Marion County has established three drop-off sites, which will be open from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily until October 27, 2024.

These drop-off sites are for noncommercial debris only, and residents must provide I.D. proving they live in an unincorporated area of Marion County.

## Former NFL Coach Tony Dungy Warns Voters: Amendment 4 Threatens the Unborn

one word about mandating money for education or law enforcement—not at all," he noted, challenging the narrative presented in campaign advertisements.

Addressing the issue of safety, Judd warned that the amendment could inadvertently support the black market for marijuana. "What it creates is an umbrella for the black market marijuana dealers who will thrive," he said. "They're not going to have it regulated... they're going to undercut the market because they're going to say, 'Hey, we've got this legal marijuana that you can possess.'"

Furthermore, Judd predicted that law enforcement would face increased complexities if the amendment passes. "The marijuana law will be more complicated... there will also be ways you can't possess marijuana, like growing your own," he explained.

In closing, Judd made it clear that he does not support the amendment. "I'm voting no because it's a trick, and I don't like to see our folks tricked," he said.

As the vote approaches, voters are encouraged to weigh the potential benefits and drawbacks of Amendment 3 carefully.

# Hot Dog Rescue: Firefighters Brave Flames to Save Pups

Late on the night of October 19, Marion County Fire Rescue (MCFR) responded to a residential fire on Banyan Track in Ocala, where three dogs were trapped inside. The emergency call came in at 11:09 p.m., with the homeowner reporting her backyard and porch ablaze.

Units from Rolling Greens Station #28 arrived just over a minute later, finding smoke rising from the single-story home. Rescue #528 immediately initiated a search for the trapped animals while Engine #28 deployed a hoseline and conducted a 360-degree assessment of the property. Firefighters from Silver Springs Shores Station #17, Belleview Station #18, and Anthony Station #1 arrived shortly afterward to provide backup.

Crews launched an aggressive interior attack, with additional teams ventilating the roof to relieve smoke. During the search, three dogs were found inside and safely removed from the home.

The fire was declared under control at 11:34 p.m., with no injuries reported to either residents or firefighters. The cause of the fire is still under investigation, and the American Red Cross is assisting the homeowner and her pets.



## One Lucky Dog

Arriving just over a minute after the call, crews from multiple stations launched an aggressive attack to save the animals and control the blaze. The fire was brought under control within 25 minutes, and all three dogs were safely rescued. No injuries were reported. The fire's cause is still under investigation, and the American Red Cross is helping the homeowner and her pets with recovery efforts.



## Strange But True: Offbeat Tales from Across the Globe



### Newsweek Publishes 'Investigative' Article on Obviously Fake Photo

Newsweek must think we're all living under a rock. This once-respected publication has taken a nosedive into the absurd, attempting to investigate a photo of Trump that's so obviously fabricated it's almost impressive.

Trump popped into Pennsylvania last weekend, attended a Steelers game, and then shared this picture on Truth Social that was obviously fake. Newsweek, in their infinite wisdom, declared, "This looks like it could be AI-generated." Shocking, right? Because nothing says "serious journalism" like playing digital detective on a photo that's clearly been filtered more than a millennial's Instagram feed.

Let's break it down: Verified images show Trump in a suite at Acrisure Stadium, looking presidential in his blue suit and red tie—classic Trump. But in the Truth Social photo? He's strutting on the field in a Steelers jersey with biceps that would make Hulk Hogan jealous. Newsweek's "investigation" revealed Trump's "arms and torso were suspiciously more muscular"—perhaps he was trying out for a new NFL role?

Newsweek took their investigation further. They made use of an AI image detector that gave the photo an 81% chance of being computer-generated, while another site claimed it was only 30% human. Here's the kicker: Newsweek even reached out to the Trump campaign for comment on the authenticity of the photo, as well as the Pittsburgh Steelers organization to verify if the photo was real.

At this point, you have to wonder: does Newsweek think their readers are dumb enough to believe this could have been real? What a strange time to be alive.

### Pizza Toppings Gone Wild: Pizzeria Busted for Serving Up Cocaine

German police raided a pizzeria in Stuttgart after finding an unusual addition to its menu: cocaine. The discovery was made during a larger drug investigation involving a network of Italian mafia-linked operations, according to authorities.

Officers were initially suspicious of the pizzeria's activities due to frequent visits by known drug dealers. A more thorough investigation revealed that cocaine was being stashed in secret compartments within the restaurant and distributed to buyers. Some customers even placed orders for drugs alongside their pizza, making it a one-stop shop for food and narcotics.

The investigation is part of a larger crackdown on organized crime syndicates across Europe, which have long used pizzerias and other seemingly innocuous businesses as fronts for their illegal activities. In this case, police suspect the pizzeria was linked to the 'Ndrangheta, a powerful Italian mafia group heavily involved in international drug trafficking.


"The sticker makes me fall asleep," Layne reported, prompting her mother, Lisa, to do some detective work of her own. After asking her daughter to bring home one of the so-called "sleepy stickers," Layne managed to sneak one out of class—consider it a stealth mission for the 4-year-old student.

Upon investigation, Lisa discovered that the patch in question was none other than the over-the-counter Sleep Z Patch, loaded with melatonin and an array of other ingredients that likely wouldn't pass muster at a health food store. Armed with her newfound evidence, she marched back to the school to present her findings—only to be met with the sounds of crickets.

Unperturbed, Lisa rallied the other parents, who soon learned their little ones had all become familiar with the "sleepy sticker." Faced with a burgeoning parent protest, the school finally sprang into action, suspending the teacher and aides while the Spring Police Department conducts an investigation.

In a statement, school officials declared, "The safety of our students is our highest priority," while also reminding everyone of the strict policy against doling out any medication—be it prescription, nonprescription, or even herbal.

But let's take a moment to empathize with these educators. At \$34 for a pack of 28 Sleep Z Patches on Amazon, it seems these teachers may have been in desperate need of a little peace and quiet. Just goes to show: sometimes, it's not the lesson plans that need revision—it's the naptime strategies!



### Who Let the Drones Out? Langley Air Force Base Still in the Dark

For 17 chaotic days in December 2023, Langley Air Force Base found itself at the mercy of unidentified drones, buzzing the skies like particularly determined lawnmowers on a caffeine bender. These drones didn't attack or interfere with base personnel. Still, the mere fact that they were zipping through restricted airspace at 100 miles per hour set off a few alarms.

"None of the incursions appeared to exhibit hostile intent," said a base spokesperson, presumably trying to downplay the oddity of having rogue drones in a highly controlled military zone. "But anything flying in our restricted airspace can pose a threat to flight safety." You know, because having a sky full of kamikaze-capable drones from who-knows-where isn't unsettling at all.

The Department of Defense, with all its advanced tracking technology, was apparently outmatched by the drones' evasive maneuvers, which were reported to be "hard to track." So, while we're left with no leads as to where they came from or who sent them, we can all take solace in the fact that at least nothing exploded.

Yet.

In fact, Langley isn't alone in this aerial mystery. Two months before the drone swarm hit Virginia, five other drones made an appearance over Nevada's Nuclear Security Site, where the Department of Energy conducts nuclear-weapon experiments. They stayed for a three-day joyride—probably checking out the sights before heading back to their undisclosed drone lair.

So, now we're left with two incidents, no clear connections, and a very real drone problem on our hands. The Air Force is reportedly considering installing drone netting over the base—a high-tech, anti-drone shield of sorts. However, the net would have to be retractable so planes can actually take off. Because let's face it, in the middle of a national security crisis, the last thing we need is the Air Force grounded by its own mosquito net.

According to authorities, unless the drones are an "imminent threat", by law they cannot be shot down near military bases.

Additional reports indicated that a nuclear weapons testing site near Las Vegas bolstered its defenses against drones after multiple uncrewed aircraft were observed flying over the Nevada National Security Site in October 2023. The source and intent of these drone flights are still unclear.

# Marion County Crime Wire: Tales from the Underbelly

## Grandson Allegedly Brandishes Knife, Waves Gun at Grandmother

A Marion County man has been arrested and charged with elder abuse following a disturbing incident involving his elderly grandmother. Jason Navarro Jr., recently discharged from the U.S. Army, was taken into custody after deputies responded to a suspicious 911 call from his grandmother's home.

Deputies arrived at the residence following a hang-up 911 call. Upon their arrival, they encountered Navarro, who informed them that he was staying with his grandmother. He allowed the deputy into the home, where they found the victim hiding in the bathroom, visibly shaken and fearful.

The victim, who is over 65 years old, alleged that her grandson's behavior had become increasingly erratic since he moved in after Labor Day. She reported incidents where Navarro threatened her with a knife, dragged the blade across her leg, and waved a gun around the house. She recounted one particularly chilling moment when Navarro pointed a gun—belonging to her late husband—at her multiple times, leaving her in fear for her life.

In addition to the physical threats, the victim described Navarro's emotional abuse. He allegedly prevented her from eating, laughed at her struggles to care for his dog, and even exposed himself to her, adding to her distress. She told deputies she had lost weight since he moved in, attributing it to the stress and fear she felt living with him.

Navarro denied any serious wrongdoing but declined to speak further after being read his Miranda rights. He admitted to occasional cannabis use for anxiety but claimed he did not suffer from PTSD or any other mental health issues following his discharge from the military.

The victim expressed that she felt like a prisoner in her own home due to Navarro's behavior. Despite the fear she has lived under, she will remain in the residence. Navarro was transported to the Marion County Jail, and a trespass order was issued, barring him from returning to the property.

This incident serves as a stark reminder of the vulnerability of elderly individuals and the importance of vigilance in safeguarding their well-being. Navarro faces charges of elder abuse and assault on a person over 65.



## Home Invader Claims: "Get Out of My House!" (Spoiler: It Wasn't His House)

Ocklawaha, FL – On the quiet morning of October 18, local deputies were dispatched to a property that quickly became the scene of what can only be described as a Florida-style showdown. Bryant Given, who police say was found in a compromising position on someone else's land, is now facing charges of assault and burglary with a side of battery.

Deputy Surajbali, the first responder, arrived at 16053 SE 100th Lane to find Mr. Given dusting himself off, attempting to make a subtle exit from the crime scene. When asked what in the world was going on, Given calmly pointed at a group of construction workers, claiming they were trespassing. However, things got murky when Given began to retreat and refuse further questioning, landing him in handcuffs for the rest of the conversation.

Witnesses painted a different picture: According to James Simoneau, an electrician on the job site, Given strolled into a home under construction as though it was his weekend getaway, then meandered toward a nearby mobile home where the property's actual owner, Anthony Triani, lives. After an awkward moment where Given allegedly made himself at home—complete with a visit to Triani's fridge—things took a turn when Given reportedly shouted, "Get out of my house or I will kill you." You know, the kind of warm welcome any Florida homeowner expects.

Naturally, Triani was less than thrilled about this uninvited guest, so a scuffle ensued, complete with Triani's grandson, Sage Holiday, playing the role of bat-boy, handing his grandpa a baseball bat to help eject Given from the premises. A struggle over the bat followed, as one does when someone thinks your fridge is their own personal snack stop.

In a final act of alleged belligerence, Given reportedly threw a punch at Triani during his exit, only to be restrained by the electricians on-site, who probably didn't anticipate "wrestling an intruder" as part of their job description.

Given, ever the elusive conversationalist, refused to answer further questions, requesting only medical attention before being taken to the hospital. No word yet if his original complaint about those pesky construction workers trespassing has been filed.

## From Big Mac to Big Mistake: Armed Teen Arrested in Wild Rampage

**Local Man Arrested After Sharing Explicit Photos of Ex**

A Marion County man, Sean Ferson, is facing charges of stalking, sexual cyberharassment, and unauthorized access to electronic devices following an investigation into allegations made by his ex-girlfriend. The incident, which began on August 14, 2024, came to light after the victim reported receiving unwanted contact from Ferson, including the distribution of explicit photos without her consent.

According to the victim, she had been in a two-month intimate relationship with Ferson, which ended shortly after August 14. On that night, while the victim and her child were asleep, Ferson allegedly accessed her phone without her knowledge, sending explicit photos and videos of the victim to his own device. The victim stated that she had never shared such photos with him and was unaware of the unauthorized access until the next morning, when she found the images sent from her phone.

Despite Ferson's initial denial, the victim confronted him, and he eventually apologized through a series of text messages. He admitted to taking the photos and claimed he did so because he felt insecure about their relationship, stating he was "in a mood."

After ending the relationship on September 1, the victim requested Ferson cease all contact. However, the harassment reportedly escalated, with the victim receiving messages and calls from 13 different phone numbers, nine of which were confirmed to be from Ferson. He allegedly continued to send messages, often mentioning personal details about the victim and her daughter.

The situation worsened on September 23, when a mutual friend of the former couple informed the victim that he had received explicit photos of her from an unknown number. The victim recognized the photos as those Ferson had previously sent to himself. Text messages from Ferson to the friend also included derogatory comments about the victim, according to the police report.

The investigation, which included a phone extraction with the victim's consent, confirmed multiple text conversations between the victim and Ferson, where he admitted to sending the photos without her consent. Additional screenshots provided by the victim showed Ferson using various fake numbers to contact her after she blocked him.

Ferson faces charges of stalking, sexual cyberharassment, and unauthorized access to an electronic device. If convicted, he could face significant legal consequences for his actions.

**Hyundai to Owners: Park Outside, Your Car Might Be on Fire Later**

In what can only be described as every driver's worst nightmare, Hyundai is recalling nearly 2.4 million vehicles due to a fire risk. But here's the kicker: the cars might catch fire even when they're not in use! That's right, folks, your car could spontaneously combust while sitting innocently in the driveway, leaving you to question if it's safer to just walk.

The Korean automaker is recalling its hydrogen-powered SUVs from model years 2019 to 2024. Owners of these specific models will reportedly be notified in November.

Hyundai revealed in documents posted Thursday by U.S. safety regulators that a pressure relief device could break, leading to a hydrogen leak—and yes, that means your SUV might go up in flames even while it's just chilling in park.

Hyundai recommends parking these recalled car models outside and away from anything that's flammable—like your house. A fix is reportedly on the way, but in the meantime, it might be wise to avoid parking near your garage, or maybe even your lawn furniture.

Hyundai insists they'll notify owners starting in November, but perhaps don't wait until then to move your vehicle to a safer location—like the middle of a field.
